Dear Prayer Partners

Greetings in the name of Jesus

Many thanks for the prayer support while the team from PWI were in New Zealand.

We sensed a real supporting role with us wherever we went and can only say that we knew it was the Lord answering prayer. Thank you for your faithfulness.

It was prophesied on the day in Westminster Chapel 14th Sept at Westminster Chapel that the ancient doors in NZ would be opened for us, and they surely were.

The Lord had gone ahead of us and we found favour wherever we went, there was no door closed to the ministry of reconciliation.

It was also prophesied that we would find a milky substance flowing from north to south of the North Island, which was interpreted as a healing balm. The first place in the Bay of Islands we stayed at was called Kawakawa which translated means the healing tree. The first day of our prayer action we were offered a twig of leaves as a peace offering from a Maori leader, it was from the Kawakawa tree. We knew that the Lord's healing of the nation was taking place as we travelled.

Since then we have been sent an email saying that the NZ National Milk Board have decided to give the children milk daily and they showed on TV a model of NZ in the shape of NZ with milk being poured into it flowing from the north to south.

The meetings in their local church buildings called a Maori were a lot different than the British way of life in church and we soon learned to do things their way, which was an encouragement to the Maori people. We had gone in a different spirit than when the first missionaries went to NZ, the Maori were told then "you have to do church like the British"

God never meant that they should be British, He made them Maori and gave them their own way of life. We were soon accepted by them and they opened their lives to the call of reconciliation. It was clear that even in the Christian population there were many with deep wounds going back many generations. They had little understanding of how to bring reconciliation or how to enter into a time of repentance before each other. As we humbled ourselves prostrate before them they found it difficult to respond as they had never seen the British do this. They had only seen the British as a dominant and proud people looking down upon them.

Our example of humility and repentance set something flowing in the meetings we were in, bringing others to confess their sin towards each other, bowing down and humbling themselves from tribe to tribe and family to family. One pastor began asking forgiveness of his elders in the church. God is doing something precious amongst them.

This Spirit of reconciliation and healing moved with us wherever we travelled and so many lives were being touched and changed.

We visited sites where we had killed the Maori people back in the early 1800 and we confessed the sins of British imperialism. As we knelt before them on the blood stained ground, often in the rain, they wept with us and forgave with open hearts, glad to be free from the years of pain of their forebears. We stood together to ask the Lord to cleanse the ground. Then we as a team from UK laid the axe to the spirit of betrayal and rejection of the Maori people.

We were able to go to Russell in the Bay of Islands, nick-named "The hell hole of the Pacific" for many years in the past. The British were the first to take alcohol, tobacco and prostitution there, which has left a residue of problematic people throughout the nation. After a full day there in Russell

in confession and repentance we found a dynamic release over the town. The Maori intercessors travelling with us renamed it The Place of Living Water.

As we travelled from the north to the south we were gradually pulling down the Freemasonry network of control over the area. Governor Grey a Freemason confiscated 64 million acres of good arable land because he said the Maori people were rebellious and would not conform to Britain's rule.

We as a team found them to be a very generous and loving people, they shared their lives and homes with us quite easily, they spoiled us. We were welcomed in each place where we had been invited and given free time to share the calling of reconciliation with them.

In one place south of Auckland the leaders were forgiving us before we had repented and asked us to forgive them for holding resentment in their hearts towards the British for so many years.

We had a quality time with the business men at a dinner in a very nice hotel in Auckland as we confessed the sin of the UK in abandoning the NZ trade in favour of the European Union. We had leaders of churches and some top business people from the milk and cattle industries with us, who accepted our repentant hearts and forgave the nation. We believe the Lord has begun to open doors for further trade with NZ.

When we first went in the 1800's we went to fight against the Maori and to control them. Now we as prayer warriors shall go and fight spiritually with them to help bring liberty and freedom to the land which God gave them custodianship of.

We believe **there is a life to live after reconciliation** so having been invited to go again to stand with the people of Aotearoa (NZ) we shall return to help complete the call already started and on its way. We shall see what fruit there is from this trip and trust the Lord to reveal His heart for the future of NZ.

To share everything that the Lord did would take a long time.

There is still a lot more to do in NZ as we have only covered the north of North Island as yet. We still need to be standing in the gap for our own nation, to bring release of its past sin. We can only say that it was a real privilege and honour to represent many different prayer movements in UK.
